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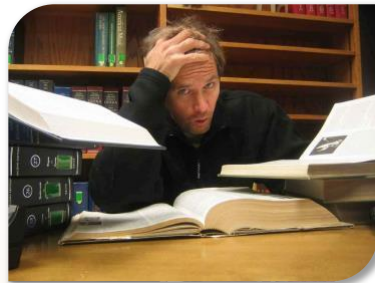

What is Stewardship?

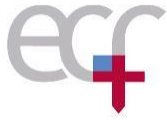

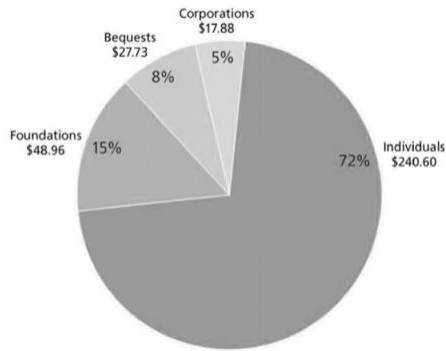
Stewardship is the way we use/manage/utilize our resources to carry on our mission in the world.

(in billions of dollars; all figures are rounded)

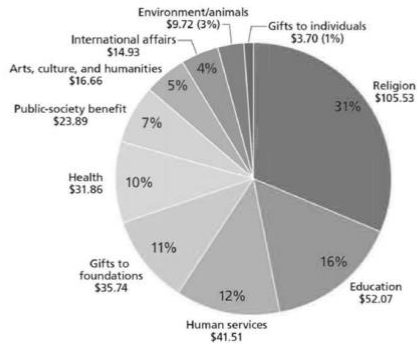

- What happens January through September?



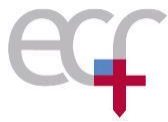

Economy's Counterintuitive Connection

- You are more likely to volunteer if you are employed than if you aren't.
- States with higher rates of unemployment tend to have *lower* rates of volunteering.

The most important thing separating volunteers from non-volunteers is **NOT** free time.



The Role of Meaning Making and Impact



Workers who find their jobs meaningful are more engaged and less likely to leave their current positions



The Role of Gratitude

Your thanks should be:

- Timely
- Personal
- Done in a way that evokes your mission

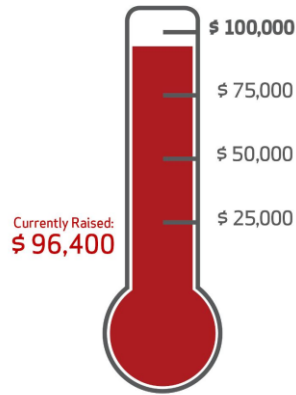

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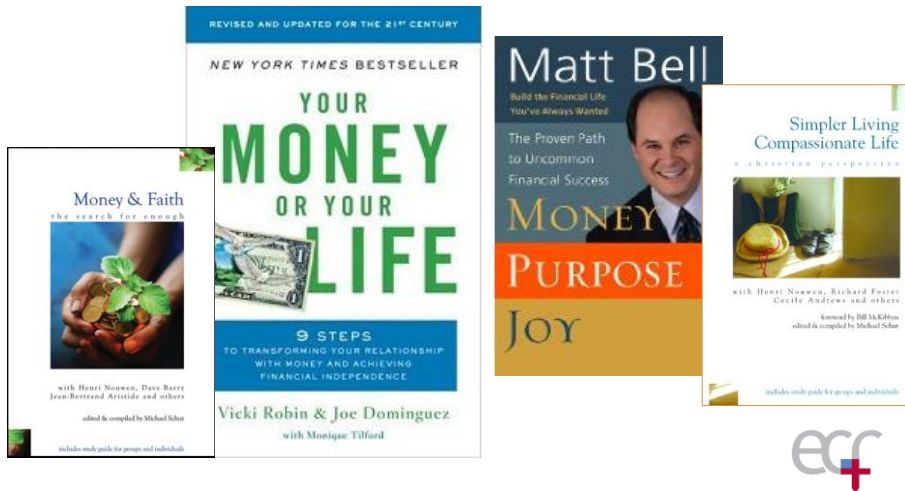

Give Thanks and Educate



- Think of ways to thank donors 7 times.
- Thanking becomes a means of showing stewardship

What if EVERYONE Did This?



- Year round ministry moments (one minute)
- Baskets of thanks
- Volunteer of the week/month
- Recipients of actual outreach speak
- Calculate the number of volunteer hours each week and assign monetary amount
- Weekly email from different ministry saying “thank you for your gift/impact”
- Show impact of every \$1 raised through out year

- Begin Volunteer of the Week
- Begin preaching on how giving impacts mission
- Calculate # of volunteer hours just for Sunday morning
- Sign parish leadership up on Giving Networks
